- a) Recommend the Board of Education approve the attached addendum to the Schedules of Substitute Teachers and Nurses, Teaching Assistants, Clericals, Paraprofessionals, and Custodians.
- P-9-- Recommend the Board of Education approve the following changes in Table of Organization:
 - 1) Temporary increase of 0.95 FTE to support the creation of the position of Director of Elementary Curriculum (K-5) for the Harley Avenue Primary School and the James H. Boyd Intermediate School from January 1 through June 30, 2013. This position will provide administrative support needed for the implementation of the Common Core Curriculum as well as for the Annual Professional Performance Review (APPR.) The majority of the funding for this position will come from within the 2012-2013 Table of Organization.
 - 2) Temporary decrease of 0.4 FTE teacher position already contained within the Table of Organization. This decrease will help to offset the cost of the administrative position being created above for the period January 1 through June 30, 2013.
 - 3) Temporary decrease of a 0.6 FTE teaching assistant position.
 - 4) The result of action #2 and #3 is the creation of a hybrid position of a 0.6 FTE Teacher and a 0.4 Teaching Assistant position.
 - 5) Increase of 0.2 FTE for a Library Media Specialist in the Elwood Middle School. The dollars to support this increase are coming from within the Middle School's 12/13 non-personnel budget areas.
 - 6) Decrease of 1.0 FTE for a Confidential Secretarial Assistant position in the Business Office effective February 27, 2013.
 - 7) Increase of 1.0 FTE for an Assistant Business Administrator in the Central Office effective January 1, 2013. This action will result in changing the confidential secretarial position in #6 above to an administrative position in the Business Office. The vast majority of the funding for this position is coming from the confidential secretarial position code/line.
